



# Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA)

## CRRSAA CARES ACT II and III

### REPORTING DATE: **March 30, 2022**

---

On December 27, 2020, the [Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act \(CRRSAA\)](#) was signed into law. The bill authorized \$22.9 billion in COVID-19 relief funding for higher education and includes funding to be distributed directly to students, as well as funds to offset institutional costs caused by the pandemic. The grant is administered through the U.S. Department of Education.

Century College has received its CRRSAA funding from the U.S. Department of Education in the amount of **\$446,112**. Under the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) II Proprietary Institution Grant Funds for Students (CFDA 84.425Q) ((a)(4) and the amount of **\$257,709** for additional Education Emergency Relief Funds (HEERF) III. Therefore, CC is required under the terms of the award to provide all funding as direct support to students to offset their increased costs as a result of the pandemic. The following information is provided by Century College as required by the Department of Education ("ED") in order to comply with the reporting requirements under the CRRSAA Act.

**As of March 30, 2022 , after an internal reconciliation of issued awards and voided checks the net amount disbursed for the reporting period ending December 30, 2021 was that of \$228,900.00 that was awarded to eligible active students.**

For reporting period ending **March 30, 2022**, (between January 2, 2022 until March 30, 2022) the total amount of HEERF II and III funding disbursed to eligible students was that of **\$243,250.00**. Therefore, the total amount of aid disbursed between October 2021 until March 2022, is that of **\$472,150.00**. The remaining amount of **\$231,671.00** will be disbursed to eligible students on or before August 26, 2022.



# What is the CRRSAA and the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II?

Century College is committed to helping our students who have been financially affected by COVID-19. The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSSA) is a federal law and provides funds to higher education institutions to provide emergency financial aid grants to **eligible students** in order to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) II and III.

## Will everyone who applies receive a CRRSAA Student Emergency Aid Grant?

The amount of funds that CC received from the U.S. Department of Education for direct emergency financial aid grants to students was **\$703,821**. This amount is to support all students that have not previously received funding under the Cares Act Program.

Century College will follow federal eligibility criteria that requires that students be eligible for federal aid and **demonstrate a financial need** for expenses directly related to disruption due to COVID-19. We have developed a plan to prioritize students with exceptional need and help as many students as possible while still awarding an amount that is meaningful.

For this reporting period ending March 30, 2022, the application process for fiscal year 21-22 began on January 2, 2022 and closed on March 16, 2022. For this reporting period, Century College has disbursed aid to 175 current new active students that began enrollment between January 10, 2021 through January 2022.



# What is a CRRSAA Student Emergency Aid Grant?

Grants for students may be used for any component of a student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus. Grant funds can help students pay for eligible expenses such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or childcare.

## Who is eligible?

The federal government has established the [eligibility criteria](#) that students must meet in order to receive CRRSAA Student Emergency Aid Grants. Students who are eligible or otherwise be considered eligible for federal aid and have a financial need were considered. Students must be currently enrolled or be non-pell recipients that are currently enrolled or have graduated since 3/13/20 (during the period of the National Emergency) to date.

- The U.S. Department of Education **does not** allow HEERF II Student Emergency Aid Grants to be awarded to:
  - International students
  - Undocumented students
  - Student who left Century College prior to March 13, 2020.



## How do I apply?

The application for HEERF II and III funding is available through our ADM system. Here <https://centurycollege.diamondadm.com/login>. Applications will be reviewed on a first- come, first-served basis and will be prioritized based on exceptional need until all funds have been disbursed.

## How will I receive my award?

Funds will be distributed directly to the student by the institution unless a student opts for any award to be applied directly to their balance.

## Will the CRRSAA Student Emergency Aid Grant first go towards paying any outstanding charges on a student's account?

Students may elect to have the award go to an outstanding account balance or to bypass any outstanding charges and be distributed directly to the student. Students may indicate their preference by contacting the bursar's office. If the student decides to pay the outstanding account balance, this must be authorized in writing.



## Is this grant included in my gross income?

No, nor can it be claimed as a deduction or credit for expenses paid with the grant including the tuition and fees deduction, the American Opportunity Credit, or the Lifetime Learning Credit (section 139 of the Internal Revenue Code).
